From the Principal

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

This week marks the middle of Term 1. It has been pretty jam-packed and seems to be flying by quickly. NAPLAN is earlier in 2023 than it has been previously and our Year 3 and year 5 students will be involved in this from next week.

NAPLAN is designed to measure education systems to determine areas of improvement. The best way we can prepare our students for NAPLAN is to reassure your child that NAPLAN tests are just one part of their school program. Please encourage your child to simply give it their best shot on the day and to not stress about the test. We don't expect our kids to do any cramming and if you have any questions or concerns please feel free to talk with your child's teacher or myself.

You may have noticed the awesome new staff display in the front office.

I would like to publicly thank Kirsty for all the time she has put into this and cutting out photos and photo frames. It looks great, brightens up the front office area and provides a visual for our amazing team. I'm a bit biased, but I reckon we look like a kind and caring bunch.





As we hit this middle point in the term, I have been looking at our student attendance data for the start of this year:

- 88% of our learners have attended for more than
 60% of the time, in these first 5 weeks of school.
- Nearly 70% of our learners have attended for more than 80% of the time
- We have a core group of 16% of the school population who have attended for 100% of the time. Well-done.
- 12% of our learners have attended for less than
 60% of the time, in the first 5 weeks of school

Overall, this information is good and we know that strong attendance at school improves educational outcomes and opportunities for our children. We still need to work on the students who are attending less than 80% of the time. If you are having difficulties getting your child to school, please reach out to our leadership team or your child's teacher and we will work with you to support you in getting your child to school each and every day.

Keep those conversations coming. I always love a good chat in the yard.



Literacy in The Pond

In Literacy, we have been learning the sounds (phonemes) that letters make (graphemes). We know approximately 20 sounds already. We sing songs and make actions that help us to remember the sounds that the letters make. We practise our sounds daily and have begun some peer tutoring. The children have a turn at being the "teacher" and flash their partner the sounds on our letter flashcards. We have been using the magnetic letters to make words by listening to the sounds, matching the sound to the letter and then we blend the sounds together to read words.








Maths in The Pond

In Maths, we have been learning the principles of counting, recognising numerals 0-10 and the correct sequence of the numbers. We went on a numeral hunt around the school with our lpads and found many numerals everywhere.
