From the Principal

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

Hello again and welcome back for another year at Hincks.



We came back to work before our students arrived again and had a couple of days dedicated to learning and getting ready for 2023. Our first day was dedicated to Trauma Informed Practices and ongoing Positive Behaviour Strategies in working with all of our children (Berry Street Education Model). This day went particularly well with staff building their team toolkits to work with the children in their classes.

The second day was dedicated to our School Improvement Planning. Each year we build on our personal skills and knowledge, based on the latest research, to build the learning potential and skills of all our young learners.

Some key highlights of our School Improvement Plan in 2023 include:

Writing

- Teaching keyboarding skills from Reception to year 6
- Targeted writing conferences to support students setting specific writing goals for their personal growth in Writing
- Building student skills in writing narratives (stories), persuasive texts (opinions) and information reports (explorations)

Maths

- Making maths more visual and hands-on for all our learners, so they can grasp concepts before applying them in abstract situations.
- Using Warm-ups at the start of maths lessons to reinforce old concepts and teach the Big Ideas in Number skills.

Reading

- The new Units of Work from the Department for Education come with a range of mentor texts connected to each unit. We are using these texts, as starting points to great teaching, to build student understanding of texts at literal, structural and inferential levels of understanding.
- Our primary students do termly reviews to determine their Reading Range. Students can then access a wide variety of books from our school library or from MyON (digital library). They can also access MyON from home (Our teachers will keep you posted. Log-Ins should be coming home next week)

I am excited about this year. We have maintained a consistent staff and each year I get excited about seeing my adults, as dedicated learners, improve their personal skills to further develop our young learners to meet their optimal learning potential. This year they have taken this to a new level and I look forward to sharing this journey with you throughout the year.

Class Dojo

Parents please be aware that we now have students who need to access the Iron Knob Bus. This bus needs to pull up in the bus loop at around 8.15 every morning and then at 3.10 in the afternoon every day. The bus has a strict schedule that they need to stick to and need to make it to the next school on time.


If you need to park your car to walk in to pick up your child, please park on the road/carparks, **not the bus loop**. The bus loop is a 'kiss and drop/pick up' area, not a 'leave the car to get your child' park.

To ease the traffic congestion on Hincks Avenue, we will open the side gate up on Schulz Avenue (see map below) **in the afternoons only.** We still ask that parents use the main gate entrance in the mornings so we can keep an eye on any students who may try to leave.


We have made a car park in front of the gate/gym, which can be accessed from the gym car park. Parents are able to park here as well in the mornings and in the afternoons.

Dear parent/caregiver

For the second year, South Australian families with children attending public schools will receive a \$100 discount per student on their annual materials and services charge, delivering the government's two-year commitment made at the 2022 state election.

Approaching the start of the school year, we know cost-of-living pressures are being felt by many families and we hope this discount will provide some relief.

Unlike last year, you don't need to do anything to claim the \$100 discount. It will automatically be issued by your school.

The discount does not apply to families approved for school card as they are not required to pay the materials and services charge.

School card applications are now open for 2023. Income limits, based on the number of dependent children in your family, have been increased by 6.4% this year. With this increase, some families who were not previously eligible may now qualify. Information on school card eligibility, income limits and the application process can be found at: sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard.

If you are experiencing financial difficulty and require assistance paying the discounted materials and services charge, we encourage you to speak to your school as soon as possible. Support is available to those who need it, including the option of paying the charge by instalments.

As a compassionate response to the ongoing nature of the conflict in the Ukraine, Ukraine nationals arriving in Australia will continue to receive fee-free education in 2023 in South Australian public schools. Support will also continue to be provided to Afghan evacuees.
