News from Art with Miss Helen

During the arts this semester, the Pond and the Cygnets began by learning about the elements of visual art (line, shape, colour, form, tone, pattern and texture) and implementing them in their own artworks. This led to them learning about why people make art and where they see art in their own lives. We took a closer look at an artist called Megan Coyle, who uses ripped up pieces of paper to create artworks, which we then had a go at trying for ourselves.





We then learned about Indigenous Australian symbols and what they mean, we then used them to create our own family stories. Continuing with the theme of family, in term two we began our music program where we have been learning a song called Ngaya Naba. This is an Indigenous song about family and how we are stronger when we are with our family. Whilst learning this song we have been engaging with rhythm, tempo and beat whilst also using our amazing singing voices and experimenting with different instruments.

This semester the Lighthouse, Prickly bunch, Mighty Lions, G.O.A.T.S and the Sixers have learned about Indigenous bush medicine at the Gabmididi Manoo preschool bush tucker garden. We then learned about an artist called Gloria Petarrye and how she painted bush medicine leaves in her artworks to pay homage to the land and how it supports health.





In media arts we have learned about modern Japanese culture, how and why the art movement of Kawaii, Manga and Anime changed the more traditional culture of Japan and how the art forms have swept across the world and featured in many comic books, games, television series and movies. We created our own Kawaii and Anime characters and are transforming them into clay figurines to create our own short Claymation (Clay based stop motion animation) movies.
