From the Principal

Dear Parents / Caregivers,

Hello again and welcome back for another year at Hincks.

We came back to work before our students arrived again and had a couple of days dedicated to learning and getting ready for 2024. On our first day we joined with

Long Street PS to learn more about **The Berry Street Education Model** of using trauma informed practices across our school to support students with managing their behaviour and learning. This day went particularly well with staff building their team toolkits to work with the children in their classes.

The second day was dedicated to our **School Improvement Planning**. Each year we build on our personal skills and knowledge, based on the latest research, to build the learning potential and skills of all our young learners.

Some key highlights of our School Improvement Plan in 2024 include:

Writing & Reading

- o Introducing Playberry Laser as a multisensory approach to teaching literacy in all year levels.
- Using a teaching and learning cycle with mentor texts to teach children to understand texts (read) and construct texts (write) across all areas of the curriculum.
- Teaching keyboarding skills from Reception to year 6
- Targeted writing conferences to embed student agency in setting goals for their personal growth in Writing.

Maths

- o Include Number Fact Fluency tasks at the start of each Maths lesson, as a part of a new maths lesson structure to promote student understanding of number.
- o Making maths more visual and hands-on for all our learners, so they can grasp concepts before applying them in abstract situations.
- Teachers collaboratively design maths units of work to promote student engagement and self-efficacy in Maths

I am excited about this year. We have maintained a good consistent staff and each year I get excited about seeing my adults, as dedicated learners, improve their personal skills to further develop our young learners to meet their optimal learning potential. This year they have taken this to a new level and I look forward to sharing this journey with you throughout the year.






Class Dojo

It has been amazing seeing so many families connect via Class Dojo in the first few days back this year. Class dojo for families is used for teachers to send class-based information to parents and for families to connect with staff via messages within the app.

When using Class Dojo, you will only need a free account, do not feel that you have to pay for Dojo Plus as the elements of Dojo we use within HAPS do not require this. If you require a new code to access your child's class, please contact your class teacher or staff at the front office.



Car Parking at Hincks Avenue P.S




If you need to park your car to walk in to pick up your child, please park on the road/carparks, **not the bus loop**. The bus loop is a 'kiss and drop/pick up' area, not a 'leave the car to get your child' park.

To ease the traffic congestion on Hincks Avenue, we will open the side gate up on Schulz Avenue (see map below) in the afternoons only. We still ask that parents use the main gate entrance in the mornings so we can keep an eye on any students who may try to leave.

We have made a car park in front of the gate/gym, which can be accessed from the gym car park. Parents are able to park here as well in the mornings and in the afternoons.

We encourage all parents to come into the yard at the end of the day and utilise seating and shelters while waiting for the students to finish school. Please do not enter classrooms until after the bell goes.

THE NEW MID-YEAR INTAKE TO RECEPTION STARTS IN 2024.



STARTING PRIMARY SCHOOL

In South Australia, the first year of primary school is called reception.

From 2024, children who turn 5 years old:

- before 1 May can start school in term 1
- between 1 May and 31 October can start school in term 3 (mid-year intake)
- after 31 October can start the next year

Children who start school at the beginning of the year will complete 4 terms of reception

Children who start school in a mid-year intake will complete 6 terms of reception.


