




News from The Dragons 3/4


This term in English, we have been learning how to write different kinds of text pieces. At the start of the term, we learned about narratives and how to involve an audience in our text pieces.





















Captain Australia Visit

On Tuesday, 9th April, students were treated to a visit by Captain Australia and his family.

Captain Australia's real name is Simon. 7 and a half years ago, Simon was diagnosed with Stage 4 head and neck cancer and told he had 6 months to live. To overcome the devastating impact of the fight to live, on 26th of December 2021, he walked from Brisbane to Melbourne (2200km+) dressed as the superhero Captain Australia in support of a charity called 'The Kids Cancer Project'. He arrived in Melbourne's Federation square on the 18th March 2022.

Captain Australia is now completing a bigger and more significant challenge, Captain Australia's BIG LAP, where he will walk all around Australia in service of the charity 'The Kids Cancer Project'.

Captain Australia spoke to students about his journey so far on his walk and raised awareness about cancer and what people have to go through when they are diagnosed.
