I can't believe how quickly this term has flown by! We are over half way already.



As you know, I have been Acting Principal while Mel Gloede is at MOPS. I am loving

the challenge and the opportunity to learn new things. Carlene Paterson (Deputy Principal), Robyn Lindholm (Student Wellbeing Leader) and I are working well together to keep things running smoothly. I've spoken with Mel a few times and she is enjoying seeing how different schools do things and is looking forward to coming back to us with new knowledge and ideas.

I've been trying to get into classrooms regularly and have noticed that our classrooms are humming along nicely and most students are settled and working hard. The Playberry Laser Literacy focus is having an impact already and we are seeing growth for many of our students.

We have had another busy term. During weeks 2 and 3, all our classes had swimming lessons at the Rec Centre. Year 4, 5 and 6 students participated in the Whyalla schools Soccer Carnival, making us very proud by coming runners up. Junior Primary students visited the Road Safety Centre to attend safety sessions run by SAPOL. Our Bush Foods groups have been busy planting, watering, and cooking, and the Wellbeing groups have been busy learning new skills and creating. Classes have been on excursions and the senior students attended a full day STEM Expo at UniSA. In amongst all that, a lot of learning has also been happening!

During Reconciliation Week, Kenniesha and Anita worked with each class on an activity based on the theme of 'Now More Than Ever', encouraging everyone to continue the focus on justice and rights for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.

We also hosted a very successful Reconciliation Week Open Afternoon. We had many providers set up in the yard, with Shooting Stars, Mission Australia, Plaza Youth, The Smith Family, Centacare and Nunyarra providing activities for children and information for families. Why Day brought their fabulous array of focus tools and 3D printed toys for families to purchase, and we were lucky enough to see a 3D printer in action.

The R.O.O.T.S. program spent the previous week with our students, cooking delicious Banana and Wattle seed Muffins, Old Man Saltbush cheesy scrolls (my favourite), and Quandong White Christmas. Aunty Anita cooked damper to go with the sausage sizzle lunch and some of our staff cooked spring rolls and noodles. No one went home hungry! Some of the students in our Wellbeing groups had made food and keychains that were available to purchase and we are very proud of their entrepreneurship skills. Families and carers spent the afternoon visiting classrooms, joining in with class activities and catching up with class teachers.


